To all to Whom These Presents Shall Come:

WHEREAS, the City of Frankfort in the State of Kentucky has a significant interest in the continued vitality of general aviation, aircraft manufacturing, aviation educational institutions, aviation organizations and community airports; and

WHEREAS, general aviation and the Capital City Airport have an immense economic impact on the City of Frankfort; and

WHEREAS, Kentucky is home to 59 public-use airports, which serve 5,647 pilots and 1,431 active general aviation aircraft; and

WHEREAS, Kentucky is home to 53 fixed-base operators, 40 repair stations, 115 heliports, 4 FAA-approved pilot schools, 1,187 flight students and 1,060 flight instructors; and

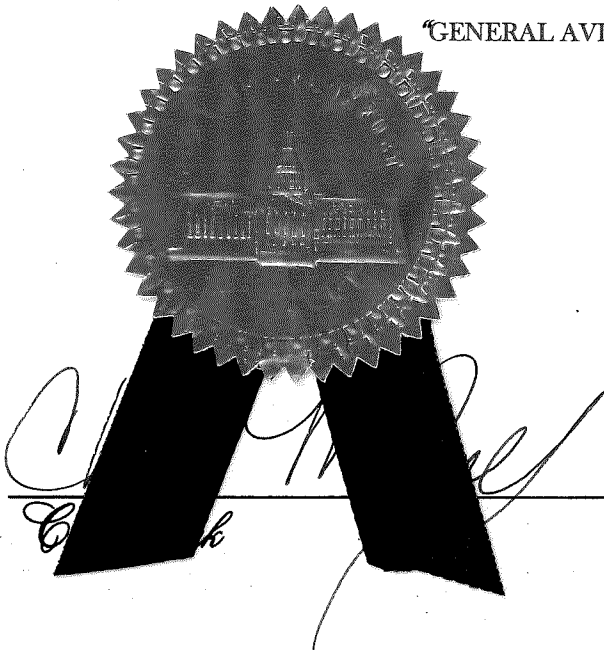
WHEREAS, general aviation not only supports Kentucky's economy, it improves overall quality of life by supporting emergency medical and healthcare services, law enforcement, firefighting and disaster relief, and by transporting business travelers to their destinations quickly and safely; and

WHEREAS, the nation's aviation infrastructure represents an important public benefit, and Congressional oversight should be in place of this system to ensure that it remains a public system and serves communities of all sizes.
